## Actor's Workshop

STANLEY GOLDMAN Professor of Law

Before joining the tenured faculty at Loyola, Stan Goldman spent eight years as a deputy Los Angeles County public defender in downtown Los Angeles. He has tried approximately 70 jury and 300 court trials and has appeared as counsel in every level of federal and California court, including the California and United States Supreme Courts. He teaches, or has taught, Criminal Law, Criminal Procedure, Evidence, Legal Ethics, Film and Law, as well as Law and Genocide. He is the founder and director of the Loyola Center for the Study of Law and Genocide.

Professor Goldman published approximately 90 columns as a special correspondent for the New York Daily News. He has worked as a news correspondent and legal analyst for numerous television and radio networks and news organizations covering predominantly legal subjects. For nine months, he anchored a three-hour, four-day-a-week national program on CBS Network Radio. He spent two and a half years as a regular contributor on CNBC, where he would rotate as host of a one hour Saturday evening show "Talk Live." He spent over than 10 years in a full-time capacity as the Fox News Channel's sole legal editor, on-air news correspondent/analyst and occasional anchor and host. As a legal correspondent he was present in the courtroom covering the trials of O.J. Simpson, Timothy McVeigh, Michael Jackson, Scott Peterson and scores of others. At Fox News, amongst other assignments, he was the network's lead analyst covering the impeachment of President Bill Clinton.

Professor Goldman has published 21 articles in scholarly law journals discussing aspects of the law of evidence, criminal law, criminal procedure and genocide. Two of his recently published law review articles were entitled: "In Defense of the Damned" (thoughts on why it is a good thing to represent obviously guilty people), and "The Jew Who Met Himmler" (a historical examination of the origins of the international crime of genocide as it arose out of the Holocaust).

Professor Goldman's critically acclaimed history/memoir *Left to the Mercy of a Rude Stream: The Bargain that Broke Adolf Hitler and Saved My Mother*, was published in December 2018 by Potomac Books, with an unabridged audio version released by Tantor, a division of Recorded Books. One critic said of it - "If you only have time to read one book about the history of the Holocaust, make it this one."
